FROM THE HEADTEACHER

It has been another very full week here at St Mary's and as I have walked around the school this week, there has been a definite sense of purpose in all the classrooms. I have been privileged to see a range of lessons where pupils are engaged and excited about their learning.

On Monday afternoon we took part in the Maynard Cup football match against Hatfield Community Free School, although it was a well-fought match and the team played well, we did lose the game.

A definite highlight of the week was the visit of the Bishop of Hertford on Tuesday. Bishop Jane joined us for Collective Worship, giving us a talk on how people have used their talents and been creative for God: showing us things like a painting of the last supper, a hymn book, a cross that had been carved for her, a stole that had been made for her and a bracelet. She encouraged us to think about how we can be creative with our own talents.

After Collective Worship, Bishop Jane then did a question and answer session with Years 3, 4 and 5 and answered pretty much everything from 'What made you want to become a Bishop?' to 'Do you like McDonald's?'. Bishop Jane then had a tour of the school before she left. We really enjoyed her visit and are very grateful that she found the time in her diary to come to St Mary's.

In terms of attendance this week, I am delighted to be able to inform you that all seven classes have achieved 90% or more which is a great achievement.

Today marks the 460th anniversary of the baptism of William Shakespeare at Holy Trinity Church in Stratford-Upon-Avon. The output of plays that he wrote during his lifetime was a tremendous example of creativity. Last year marked the 400th anniversary of the publication of his first folio of plays and this year The Shakespeare Birthplace Trust have published a Children's Edition. Mrs Hoile, our Chair of Governors, has kindly donated a copy of this book to our school library and the Public Speaking Club will be using it after school today.

As we continue to think about our half-termly value of creativity, I leave you with a quote from Antoine de Saint-Exupery: *"True happiness comes from the joy of deeds well done, the zest of creating things new."*

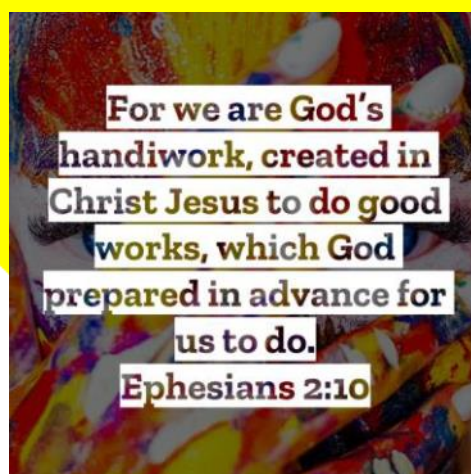

A busy week for Year 2. We have been finding out all about 2D and 3D shapes and what is special about each shape. We have found out more facts about the Great Fire of London and are very excited about this History topic. This afternoon, we have enjoyed the sunshine and spent lots of time outside :- sketching, reading and enjoying our wonderful world. Year 3 - Mandela

This week, Mandela class have had a productive and challenging week. In English, we have been exploring different experiences in different parts of the world and have just finished wondering around the Antarctic. We have just started exploring Giza's Ancient Pyramids and we started using commas in lists.

In Maths, we have been practising simple equivalent fractions with Miss Garip and Miss Ellis and by ourselves. We have learnt what a numerator and denominator is.

In R.E. we have been conducting a report about Pentecostal celebrations. We have learned what Apostles are and the story of Tongues. We have planned our report and structured it using a heading, introduction, subheading and symbols of Pentecost.

Year 4 - Attenborough

It has been a very busy and productive week in Attenborough Class. In English, we have been loving our book Frindleswylde, it is such an exciting and engaging book and the class have been producing some great work. In Maths, we finished off our fraction topic and have started looking at decimals. In RE, we have started our Hinduism topic and this week looked at how snakes and ladders is used to represent Hindu ideas. In PE, we had a go at sprinting and practised different techniques. In Music, the class are really enjoying singing and performing Blackbirds by The Beatles, they also loved singing Yellow Submarine. In Art, we started our new topics linked to the Vikings, the children looked at some art and drew their own drawings based on Viking art. It has been a really productive week, and I look forward to more exciting learning next week.



Year 5 - Luther King

Another busy week in Luther King class this week. In Maths we started looking at Decimals. We had briefly looked at decimal numbers in the Autumn term, however there is lots of new learning taking place and every member of the class has had such a positive attitude in wanting to become better mathematicians.

In English we are continuing to look at the book 'Curiosity' and we have written an account of how this Mars rover was launched into space on the 26th of November 2011 from the Kennedy Space Centre in Florida. Lots of interesting facts, why not ask the children what they can tell you about Curiosity!

In Art, we started to look at Leonardo Da Vinci and all the amazing interventions that he had recorded in his secret diary. So many of his designs went on to inspire artists, engineers, and architects in their work. It has been great to see our children starting to draw some of their own designs based on the work of Da Vinci.

So much fantastic learning taking place again this week.



Year 6 - Goodall

Year 6 Goodall are well and truly on the SATs preparation express! This week, Maths lessons have focused on revisiting areas that might need a little extra polish. They've been sharpening their skills in plotting coordinates, translating shapes, and mastering reflections – all vital tools in the SATs toolbox.

Over in English, the class has continued their exploration of the chilling "The Wind in the Walls." This week's mission? To craft an old-fashioned formal letter and an action scene bursting with descriptive adverbs – perfect for bringing their gothic stories to life!

Science lessons took a luminous turn as the children began investigating the light spectrum. They've learned that light travels in a straight line and that there's a whole world of both visible and invisible light waiting to be explored. History lessons also took a fascinating step forward with the start of a new module on the Kingdom of Benin.

To keep their brains buzzing over the weekend, some revision exercises are waiting for them in their trusty revision books.

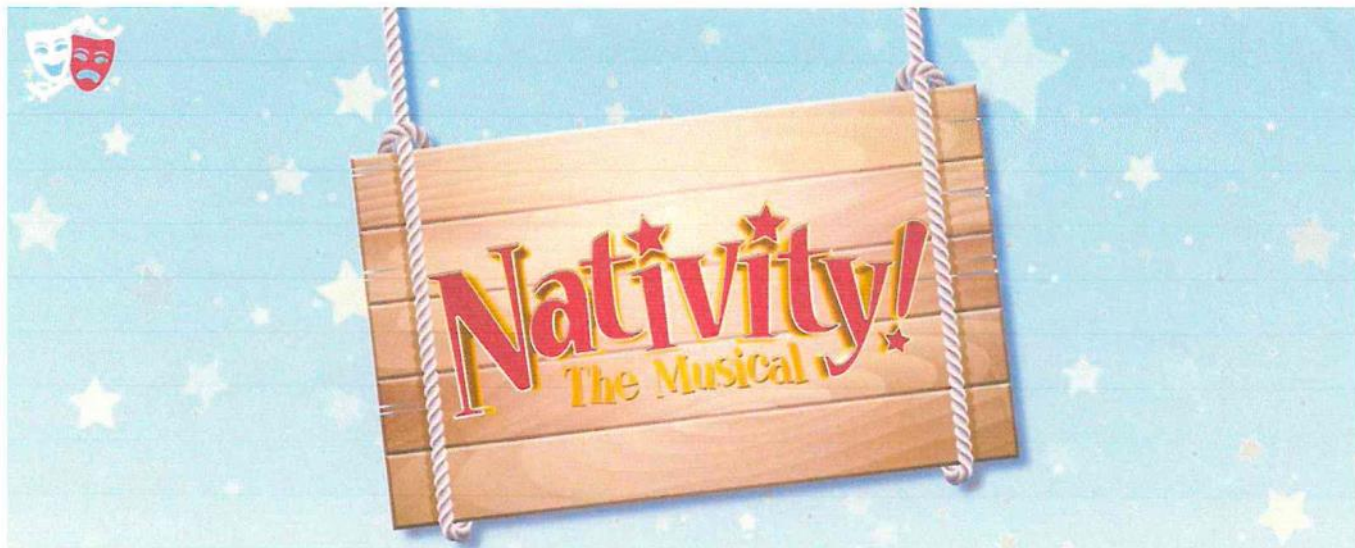
Children should wear their PE kit to school on their PE days. Reception children also have bikes and scooters on a Friday. If they can, please bring their bike or scooter and helmet to school.

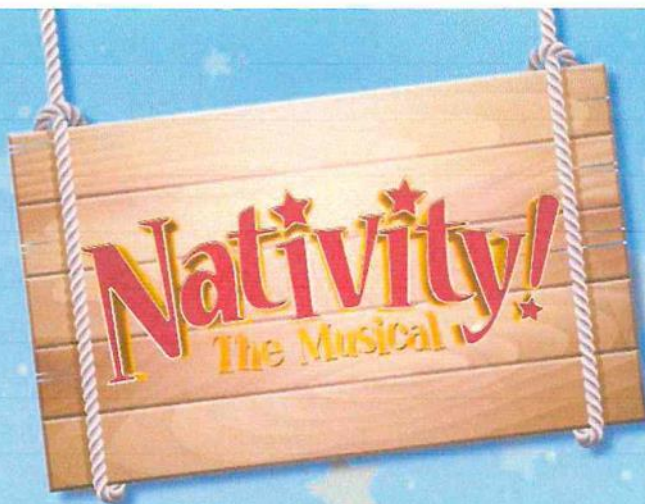
